


# OSCAR SCORER GUIDE

Instructions for teachers and evaluators to use OSCAR to score students' PBA work.


### DIRECTIONS FOR LOGGING IN

1. Using the Google Chrome browser, navigate to [mde.mzscore.com](https://mde.mzscore.com).

4. You will be taken to the Scoring screen, where you will see a box with the task and interview.



## DIRECTIONS FOR SCORING THE TASK

1. Click the checkmark next to the Task to begin scoring.

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2. The student work will load on the screen.



3. Use the zoom, rotate, and invert colors tools to view the work as you need.




4. Use the **Resources** to view copies of the rubric and student task directions in a new tab.



5. Use the right sidebar menu to select a score for each rubric item.

- Note: The items appear in the same order in the sidebar and in the rubric resource. Please make sure you are selecting a score that corresponds with the correct rubric item.**
- You have the option of typing evidence to support your scoring decision for each rubric trait.



- When you are finished, the checkmark at the bottom of the scoring tool will turn green. Click it to advance to the next student response.



- Should the need arise, you may also click the red alert symbol to flag a student response. Please only use this option if you believe that a student response indicates that a student may intend to harm themselves or others.
- When you have finished scoring all the responses in the item set, you will see an alert message that you are out of work for that item.



## DIRECTIONS FOR SCORING THE INTERVIEW

- From the Scoring screen, click the checkmark next to the Interview item.



- The interview item will load on the screen.




3. Use the **Resources** to view a copy of the rubric.



4. In the right sidebar menu, input the student's MSIS ID, last name, and first name.
